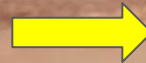

# Habitat

- Chinese pangolins live in northern India, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Myanmar, northern Indochina, southern China , and the island of Hainan
- Primary and secondary tropical forests
- Bamboo forests
- Limestone forests
- Broadleaf forests
- Coniferous forests
- Agricultural fields
- Grasslands

# Food

- Chinese Pangolins eat insects like termites and ants
- They dig into ant nests and termite mounds.
- They extract the ants or termites with their long tongue
- Some zoos feed Chinese Pangolins eggs, meat, evaporated milk products, milk powder, fish protein, orchid leaves, commercial chows, psyllium seed, carrots, yeast, multivitamins, and insects





# Why Chinese Pangolins are endangered

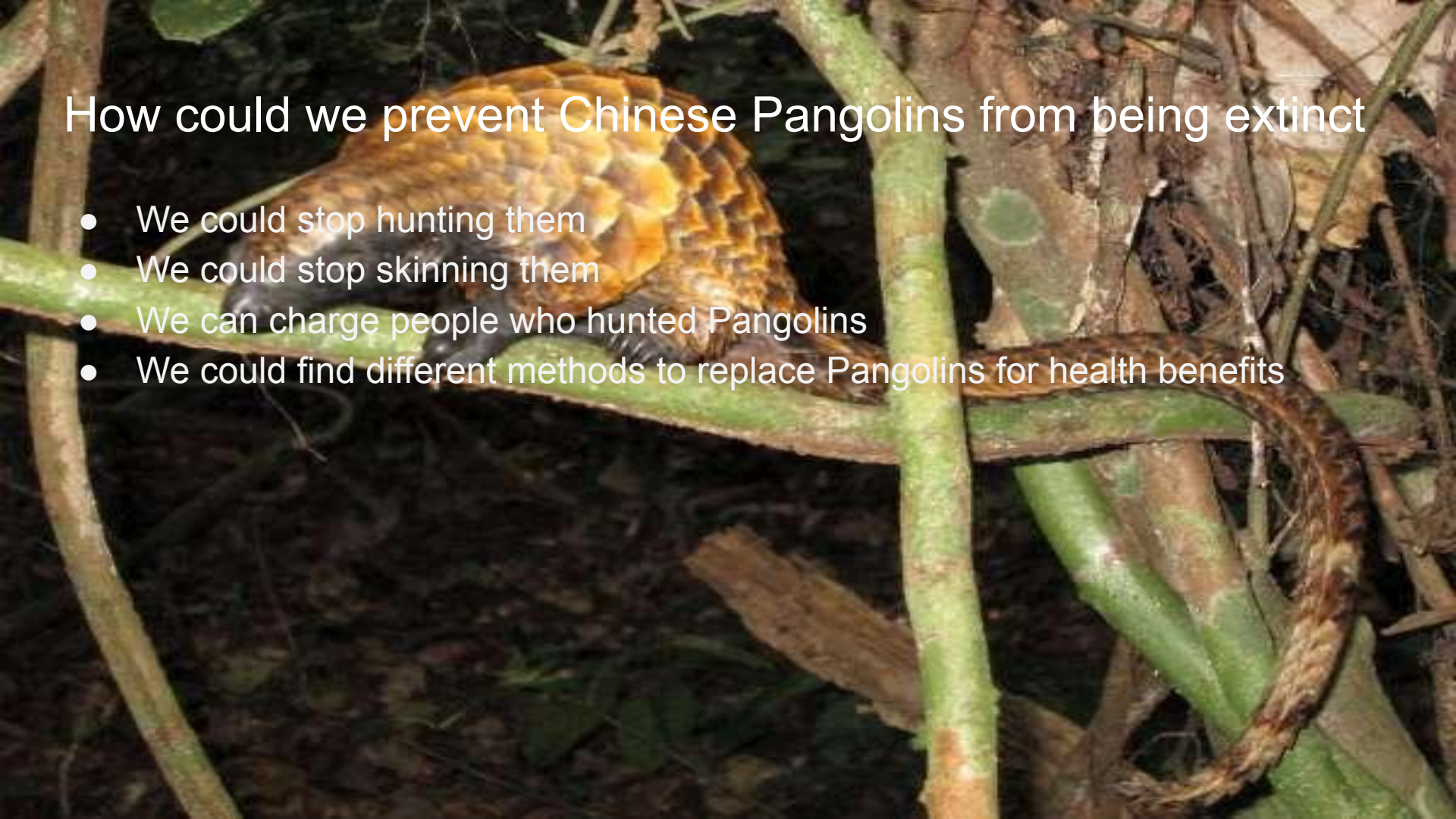
- We hunted them
- They are hunted for their meat , claws , and scales
- They are used to treat diseases like cancer, upset stomach, and asthma
- They are also used as an ingredient for traditional Chinese medicine





# How could we prevent Chinese Pangolins from being extinct

- We could stop hunting them
- We could stop skinning them
- We can charge people who hunted Pangolins
- We could find different methods to replace Pangolins for health benefits



# Population

- The Chinese Pangolin population fell by over 94%
- The population in Guangdong and Hunan have only dropped by 10%
- There are only 25,000-50,000 Chinese Pangolins that remain in the wild
