# Habitat

- Tasmanian devils live in Australia
- They live in the island of Tasmania
- They also could be found on Robbins

# Food

- The Tasmanian devil was endangered in 2008.



# How can we prevent Tasmanian devils from being extinct

- We could try to find a vaccine
- We can do check ups on the Tasmanian devils
- We can isolate Tasmanian devils that have Devil Facial Tumor Disease to prevent spreading the virus.



# Population

- There are 25,000 Tasmanian devils in the wild
- There was 150,000 Tasmanian devils before the disease
